## Noodle Tools

Noodle Tools is an online subscription that the library bought to help all students write papers or research projects. It provides a step-by-step process to write a thesis statement, create a bibliography or works cited page, make an outline and many other writing essentials. Another great facet is that teachers can look at their students' work without printing it out. And it can be accessed from home, too.

For students to access Noodle Tools, they need to create their own username and password. So far, all the 9th graders that have come in for orientation have done so, as well as Mrs. Miller's 11th and 12th graders, Mrs. Main's 10th graders and Mrs. Maghirang's 10th graders. I need all the other English classes to come in, too. Please schedule a time.

Teachers also have to create their own username and password. The link is;

From here, click on Create a Personal ID. The next screen is Register. The third screen requires a School/Library Username and Password. They are castleparkhs with the password: research.

After that, you fill out the information, and create your own username and password.
